#### ALT Journal – changes

From 2011, the Association's journal, *ALT-J Research in Learning Technology* will change its name to *Research in Learning Technology, the journal of the Association for Learning Technology.* Alongside this we have considerably expanded and broadened the membership of the journal's Editorial Board. This does not signify a decision by ALT to part company with our current publisher, rather it represents our determination to ensure that we get best value for our members from our relationship with our publisher.
