

# **Change of Government**

In the period since the General Election, along with practically every other organisation which interacts with government, ALT has been working to establish links with the new government. Flowing from this we have received a statement of support from the Rt Hon David

Willetts, Minister of State for Universities and Science, for the work of ALT and our individual, organisational and sponsoring members, and recognising the important role of learning technologists and learning technology in education and training generally. Meanwhile we are also engaged in constructive dialogue in the same vein with Ministers and officials in Scotland and Wales.

The guides were written initially by current and past members of the ALT Research Committee.
