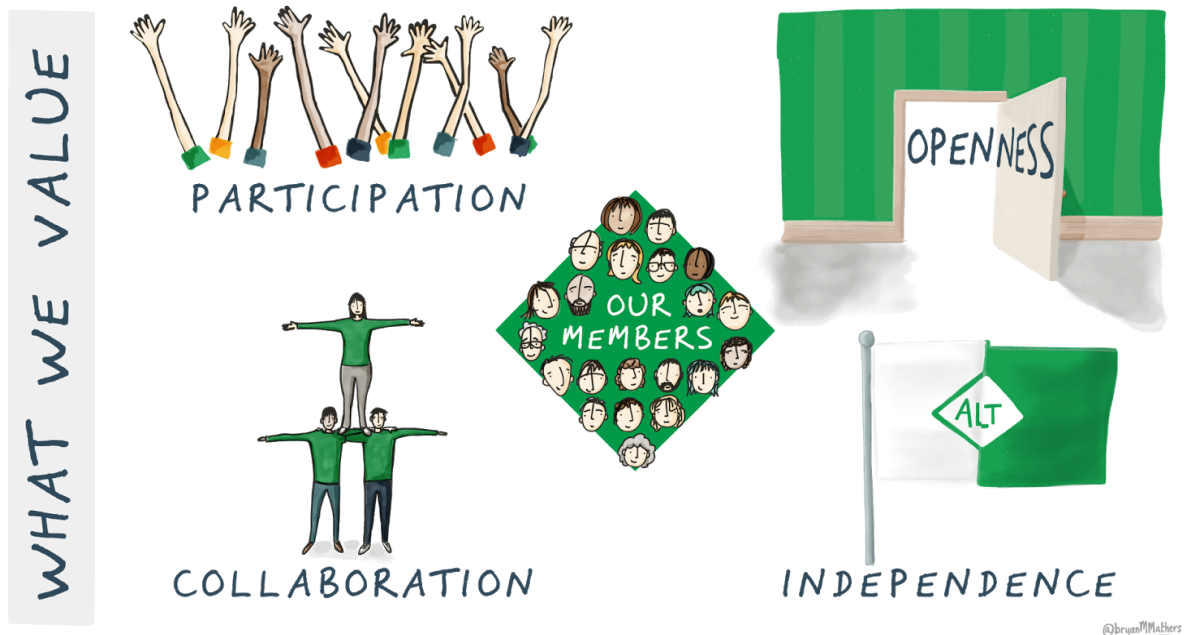


About ALT

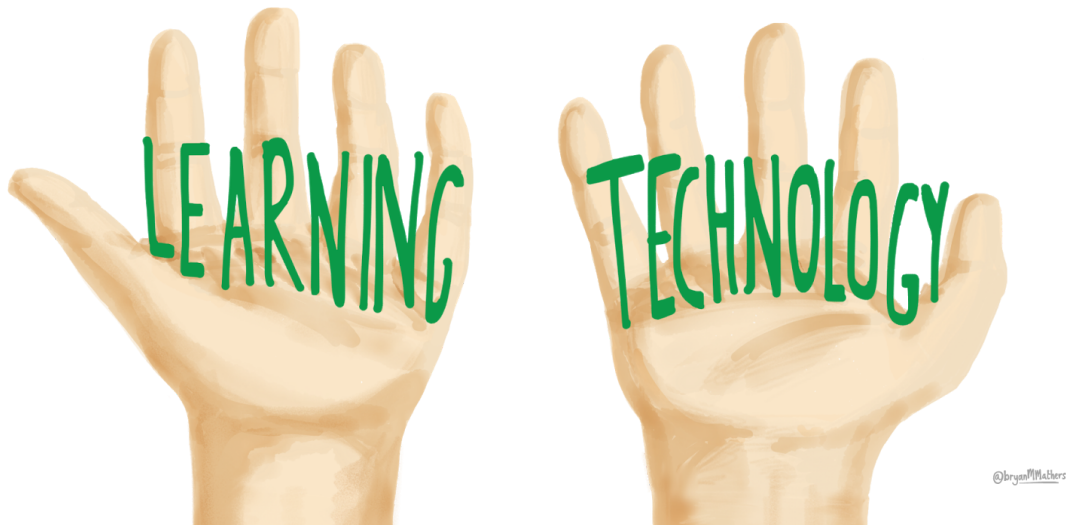

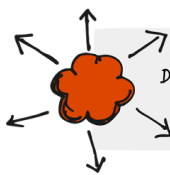
