As a course participant you have a number of ways to gain professional recognition and accreditation for participating in the course and as a next step in your professional development.

This guide provides information on the different pathways including:

- FutureLearn Statement of Participation and certified CPD hours for all participants who complete the course;
- Accreditation via professional bodies for participants who seek wider recognition of their professional practice;
- Paths to post-graduate qualifications for participants whom the course inspires to further study.



Statement of Participation

Summary

A Statement of Participation is a certificate that you can buy, to show that you've completed a FutureLearn course. You'll get your Statement in both digital and printed formats - and we ship printed Statements worldwide.

What are the benefits of buying a Statement of Participation?

Your Statement will give you official evidence, to show to your current or future employer, including:

- an outline of what you've learned and how long it took;

Qualified Teacher Learning and Skills (QTLS)

Summary

Qualified Teacher Learning and Skills (QTLS) is a professional status that you can gain by successfully completing professional formation.

Professional formation is a post-qualification process that enables you to demonstrate the effective use of skills and knowledge in your professional practice that is required to achieve QTLS status. Professional Formation is underpinned by the [Professional Standards](#) which includes promoting the benefits of technology and supporting learners in its use.

The Society for Education and Training is the only organisation that confers QTLS status following the transfer of IfL's legacy in October 2014. Membership of SET is required to undertake professional formation leading to QTLS status.

What are the benefits of gaining QTLS status?

- More than 15,000 have achieved QTLS status since its introduction in 2008
- QTLS status is recognised in law as equal to QTS for teaching in schools
- Career progression: QTLS status demonstrates your commitment, skills and knowledge to employers
- Recognition of your status as a professional teacher or trainer
- Valuable continuing professional development (CPD) that builds confidence and enhances your skills
- Members with QTLS can use these initials as a designation.

Certified Membership (CMALT)

CMALT stands for Certified Membership of the Association for Learning Technology (ALT). Established in 2004, CMALT is one of the longest established accreditation specifically for practitioners who seek recognition for the skills and experience they have.

CMALT is portfolio-based and requires each portfolio to cover 4 core areas (including implementation of technology, communication and teaching/training) and also allows participants to choose a specialist option that fits with their particular role thus providing real flexibility.

In order to provide a clear route to CMALT accreditation for course participants, we have mapped the curriculum of the course to the CMALT framework (see the [website](#) for full info).

What are the benefits of gaining CMALT?

CMALT is a peer-based professional accreditation scheme developed by the Association to enable people whose work involves learning technology to:

- have their experience and capabilities certified by peers;
- demonstrate that they are taking a committed and serious approach to their professional development.

- Inclusion on the list of Certified Members;
- Inclusion on the CMALT Consultants Register;
- Option to become a CMALT Assessor;
